



2012-2013 Grants Development Report

Each year, Wake Technical Community College submits grant proposals to federal, state, and other funding sources to support innovative initiatives college wide. During the 2012-13 fiscal year, Wake Tech received grants for 18 projects totaling \$4.4 million included the following Wake Tech initiatives:

QUICK FACTS 2012-2013

Wake Tech served 27,819 students in curriculum and 41,100 in continuing education courses: 68,919 total.

- ✓ 14,946 enrolled students already have a BA degree or higher (22% of total student body)
- ✓ 12,731 students were awarded some form of financial aid assistance - Total: \$82,065,044; \$6,446 average per student
- ✓ 2,701 students graduated from Wake Tech with an associate degree, diploma, or certificate. Since 1963 over 43,900 individuals have earned an associate degree, diploma, or certificate through Wake Tech.
- ✓ In 2012-2013 Wake Tech awarded 1,019 GEDs and 45 Adult High School diplomas. Since 1963 over 21,700 individuals have earned their GED through Wake Tech and over 2,500 individuals have earned their Adult High School diploma.
- ✓ In 2012-13 Wake Tech provided basic skills courses to 8,408 individuals.
- ✓ In 2012-13 Wake Tech offered 12,461 class sections. Some examples are:

Student Performance

- ✓ Wake Tech graduates (Associate in Arts, Associate in Science, & Associate in Applied Science) (2010-11) had an overall average GPA of 3.01 after their first year (2011-12) at a UNC System institution compared with UNC native juniors' overall average GPA of 2.89.
- ✓ 571 Wake Tech students (who earned at least 24 semester hours at Wake Tech in 2010-11) transferred to a UNC System institution in 2011-12. These students had a higher average GPA (2.89) compared with native UNC sophomores (2.78) after one year at a UNC institution.

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- U.S. Department of Labor for the creation of a two year degree program in Business Analytics.
- Gates Foundation for the creation of a Massive Open Online Course (MOOC) in developmental mathematics.
- North Carolina Biotechnology Center to enhance student learning in microbiology courses with improved curriculum and laboratory modules.
