



## 2006-2007 Grants Development Report

Each year, Wake Technical Community College submits grant proposals to federal, state, and other funding sources to support innovative initiatives college wide. During the 2006-2007 academic year grants totaling \$1.1 million included the following Wake Tech initiatives:

### QUICK FACTS 2006-2007

Wake Tech served 16,899 students in curriculum and 40,197 in continuing education courses: 57,096 total.

- 22% of enrolled students already have a BA degree or higher
- 4,324 students were awarded some form of financial aid assistance - total: \$10,034,586; \$2,320 average per student
- 1,439 students graduated from Wake Tech with an Associate degree, Diploma, or Certificate. Since 1963 over 30,000 individuals have earned an associate degree, diploma, or certificate through Wake Tech.
- In 2006-2007 Wake Tech awarded 698 GEDs and Adult High School diplomas. Since 1963 over 12,500 individuals have earned their GED through Wake Tech and over 2,000 individuals have earned their Adult High School diploma.
- 99.73% of Graduates were employed within one year
- Employer Satisfaction with Customized Training (Number of Respondents 1,640) (Percent Satisfied: 100%)
- In 2006-2007 Wake Tech provided Basic Skills courses to 7,789 individuals; 4,299 were ESL students
- In 2006-2007 Wake Tech offered over 1900 classes in the following areas in Wake County
