



QUICK FACTS 2009-2010

Wake Tech served 22,817 students in curriculum and 40,302 in continuing education courses: 63,119 total.

- 22% of enrolled students already have a BA degree or higher
- 8,523 students were awarded some form of financial aid assistance - Total: \$36,926,436; \$4,332 average per student
- 1,831 students graduated from Wake Tech with an associate degree, diploma, or certificate. Since 1963 over 33,000 individuals have earned an associate degree, diploma, or certificate through Wake Tech.
- In 2009-2010 Wake Tech awarded 758 GEDs and 72 Adult High School diplomas. Since 1963 over 14,000 individuals have earned their GED through Wake Tech and over 2,000 individuals have earned their Adult High School diploma.
- 97% employer satisfaction with Customized Training from 2,183 respondents
- In 2009-2010 Wake Tech provided basic skills courses to 8,000 individuals
- In 2009-2010 Wake Tech offered 11,259 classes. Some examples are:

Student Performance

- 84% of Wake Tech's 2007-08 University Transfer students had a GPA \geq 2.0 after 2 semesters (2008-09) at a UNC institution which exceeded the NC Community College benchmark standard of 83% for this measure.
- 368 Wake Tech students (who earned at least 24 semester hours at Wake Tech in 2007-08) transferred to a UNC System institution in 2008-09. These students had the same average GPA (2.67) after 1 year at a UNC institution as UNC native sophomores.

2009-2010 Grants Development Report

Each year, Wake Technical Community College submits grant proposals to federal, state, and other funding sources to support innovative initiatives college wide. During the 2009-2010 academic year grants totaling \$2.1 million included the following Wake Tech initiatives:

- Wake Area Health Education Centers to increase access to clinical training sites for nursing students
- National Science Foundation to improve the teaching of Science Technology Engineering and Mathematics (STEM) subjects
- American Association of Community Colleges Plus 50 initiative to develop programs for retirees and those desiring to 'recareer'
- North Carolina Community College System to support Wake Tech training programs to quickly return the unemployed to work-"Jobs Now"
