

QUICK FACTS 2018-2019

Wake Tech served 30,081 students in curriculum (CU); 42,132 in workforce continuing education (WCE); 267 students in an Algebra MOOC; 222 students in a CheMOOC; 460 in College Reading & Writing MOOC.

- ✓ 15,434 of all enrolled CU & WCE students already have a BA degree or higher (21.4% of total student body)
- ✓ 8,402 students were awarded a Federal Pell Grant Total: \$29,163,257; \$3,471 average per student
- ✓ 5,899 students were awarded Federal Loan Assistance; Total: \$32,915,118; \$5,580 average per student
- ✓ 5,882 students graduated from Wake Tech with an associate degree, diploma, or certificate.
- ✓ In 2018-19 Wake Tech awarded 411 HSEs and 58 Adult High School diplomas.
- ✓ Since Wake Tech began awarding degrees in 1963, over 24,900 individuals have earned their HSE through Wake Tech and over 2,980 individuals have earned their Adult High School diploma.
- ✓ In 2018-19 Wake Tech provided basic skills courses to 4,706 individuals.
- ✓ In 2018-19 Wake Tech offered 6,779 CU; 6,269 WCE; 13,048 total class sections. Some examples are:

Student Performance

- ✓ 447 Wake Tech graduates (Associate in Arts, Associate in Science, Associate in Applied Science) (2016-2017) had an overall average GPA of 3.04 after their first fall (2017) semester at a UNC System institution compared with UNC native juniors' overall average GPA of 2.93
- ✓ 316 Wake Tech students (who earned at least 30 semester hours at Wake Tech in 2016-2017) transferred to a UNC System institution in 2017-2018. These students had an average GPA of 2.76 compared with native UNC sophomores 2.90 after one year at a UNC institution.

2018-2019 Sponsored Programs Report

To foster innovation and address the unmet needs of the college, Sponsored Programs partners with leaders across the college to raise and manage funds in the form of grants and appropriations from federal, state, and local governments. Wake Tech was awarded grant funding for 33 projects

- ✓ **For-Credit Education & Training:** With funds from the John M. Belk Endowment and the Lumina Foundation, Wake Tech, UNC General Administration, and the NC Community College System are launching the Finish First NC initiative across the state. Finish First NC is a data tool developed at Wake Tech to analyze thousands of student transcripts against program requirements to identify students who are close to earning a credential and find students who may not have realized that they have already earned a credential.
- ✓ **Non-Credit Education & Training:** The NC Division of Vocational Rehabilitation awarded funds to UNC Chapel Hill and Wake Tech to implement the School Transition to Employment Program (T-STEP). The T-STEP program assists 16 to 21 year old students on the autism spectrum in their transition from high school to secondary education and the workforce.
- ✓ **Enrollment & Student Services:** With funds from the Sun Trust Foundation, the Student Money Management Initiative provides students with the resources, tools, and financial education needed to be fiscally responsible today and after graduation.
- ✓ **Physical Facilities:** Supported by the Triangle J Council of Governments, the Green Trek project works with community partners to provide students, faculty, and staff with free bus passes and information on ride sharing to decrease vehicle miles traveled and increase access to alternative transportations modes.
