## **CHANGE OF VISA STATUS**

To change nonimmigrant status to F-1 from another nonimmigrant status, a student must complete or provide:

- 1. Form I-539 (Please complete the form in black ink.).
- 2. Form I-20, a new complete form obtained from the International Student Office.
- 3. Proof of financial support for the first year of studies, and also for any dependents (notarized affidavit of support form, official bank letter, & last 3 monthly statements).
- 4. Letter addressed to **USCIS** requesting the change, explaining why the change is needed, educational goals, and how the education will help you when you return to your home country.
- 5. Copy of passport, including pages with photograph, passport's expiration date, entry visa, and I-797 or DS-2019 (if applicable).
- 6. Copy of I-94 Arrival Departure Record (front and back) or copy of the entry stamp of the passport along with your electronic I-94 Arrival Departure Record. You can print your electronic I-94 Arrival Departure Record at <u>https://i94.cbp.dhs.gov/I94/#/home</u>.
- 7. Proof of current legal status. (If on a dependent visa, provide copies of primary visa holder's legal status such as: passport including pages with photograph and expiration date, visa, I-94, and I-797, DS-2019, or I-20 (if applicable). You can print your electronic I-94 Arrival Departure Record at <a href="https://i94.cbp.dhs.gov/I94/#/home">https://i94.cbp.dhs.gov/I94/#/home</a>).
- 8. Copies of immigration documents for any dependents that will be changing status with you (Please refer to #5 & #6.).
- 9. A money order/check payable to **U.S. Department of Homeland Security** for \$370.00 or complete Form G-1450 Authorization for Credit Card Transactions.
- 10. **SEVIS** fee receipt, payable at <u>www.fmjfee.com</u>.

The change of status process currently takes eight to twelve months to be adjudicated by **USCIS**. If you would like to change from B1/B2 visitor's visa to F-1 student visa, please be aware that this change is not often approved unless the visitor has "prospective student" written on it and could result in receiving a notice form **USCIS** to depart the U.S. **NOTE:** A person who has changed status while in the U.S., and intends to travel outside the U.S., must obtain a new entry visa from a U.S. Consulate or Embassy before returning to the U.S.
