University Innovation Fellows

The EIC team discovered Stanford's University Innovation Fellows program in 2023 and recruited our first applicant, Devin Carhart, in Spring 2024. Devin was one of our 2024 Student Applied Benchmarking Showcase finalists. We knew her project, the Global Connections Club, would be a good fit for UIF. Devin's goal was to support Study Abroad students through cultural events and fundraising, aiming to make international experiences more accessible for her fellow students.

Devin was selected for the UIF program in August 2024 and completed UIF training in October 2024. In April 2025, Devin and her UIF mentors, Emily Moore and Dr. Rebecca Berry, traveled to the University of Twente in the Netherlands, where Devin met the other 163 students from 44 institutions across 13 countries selected for the 2024-2025 cohort. Devin was the only community college student named a Fellow this year.

The UIF program, created through a National Science Foundation grant, has trained nearly 3,000 students from 314 schools worldwide, ranging from undergraduates to Ph.D. candidates. Three of Wake Tech's 2025 EIC finalists are currently applying to be UIF Fellows in 2025-2026 with help from EIC's Melody Henderson, who will serve as their UIF mentor.
