The EIC team discovered Stanford's University Innovation Fellows program in 2023 and pinned our first UIF Fellow, Devin Carhart, in Spring 2025. In Spring 2026, Wake Tech students Elle Ruiz, Mannal Amjad, and Sehyun Park were named Fellows, joining a prestigious cohort of 77 students from nine countries focused on driving innovation and positive change in higher education. After completing six weeks of intensive training, the trio developed an Innovation Marathon designed to help Wake Tech students discover and engage with the many academic, creative, and wellness resources available across campus. Activities include a keynote presentation by innovation expert Alyssa Martina, a student success workshop led by Peer Leaders, a Makerspace session where students create 3D-printed fidget clickers, and a wellness-focused puzzle design workshop. With guidance from Student Support Director Melody Wiggins and Communication Professor Debra Buchanan, the students adapted their ideas into a collaborative initiative that earned UIF recognition. All three students were invited to present their work at the UIF Summit in the Netherlands.
