


EMPLOYEE GIVING


The Employee Campaign is active throughout the fiscal year with a special kick-off each August.

Highlights For FY 2020, the Foundation had 966 applicants! 296 applicants identified as first in family to attend college and 103 were awarded scholarships 147 veterans and/or parents & children of veterans applied and 62 were awarded scholarships 125 single parents applied and 41 were awarded scholarships 79 recent high school graduates applied and eight were awarded scholarships

DONOR RETENTION

FY 2016	872 donors out of 1,073 81%
FY 2017	967 donors out of 1,237 78%
FY 2018	962 donors out of 1,305 74%
FY 2019	946 donors out of 1,216 78%
FY 2020	936 donors out of 1,272 74%

According to Blackbaud's Benchmarking for Medium Higher Education Institutions, 48% is Average, 53.65% is Good and 60.39% is Great.The Higher Ed Benchmarking includes 4-year institutions as well as community colleges.

10 out of the last 10 years - The Foundation's retention is better than Average. 6 out of the last 6 years - The Foundation's retention is above Great.
