### Before you begin

Know yourself & consider:

1) What motivates you?

- 3) What sets you apart? What are you promoting about yourself?
- 2) What adjectives come to mind to describe you? 4) Why are you interested in the company or industry?

### **Build your Elevator Pitch:**

This will be a great start to prepare for most common interview question, "Tell me about yourself."

- Keep it brief, 30-60 seconds.
- Make it memorable, but don't overdo it.

## 2 Beyond the Pitch - Keep the conversation going:

Be Ready - Employers may ask:	<ul> <li>Why did you choose this career path?</li> <li>What do you know about our company?</li> <li>What are your career goals?</li> <li>What's a recent achievement you're proud of?</li> </ul>
Prepare questions - Show your Interest:	<ul> <li>How would you describe the ideal candidate for this job?</li> <li>Can you tell me about a typical day as a with your company?</li> <li>How many people are in the department?</li> <li>Why do you like working for this company?</li> <li>How soon do you plan to fill this job</li> <li>What's the next step? How can I arrange an interview?</li> </ul>
LEAVE A LASTING IMPRESSION	Impress the employer with the research you've done on the company or position, and communicate your experiences to relate to the position.

**3 Follow Up:** A thank you note or email can go a long way to reiterate your interest and help you stand out.
