REINSTATEMENT TO F-1 STUDENT STATUS

An F-1 student can fall out of status with USCIS in the following ways:

- If the student has not maintained a full course study as required by **USCIS** (12 hours per semester for undergraduate students)
- If the student's completion date on page 1 on the I-20 form has expired and no extension of stay was requested. If the student has worked without authorization or has worked beyond the allowed number of hours
- If the student has failed to follow the correct procedures to transfer from one institution to another within the first 15 days at the new institution
- If the student has moved to a higher degree level and did not notify the International Student Office so that **USCIS** could be notified of the student's degree change

To apply for reinstatement to F-1 student status, the student must do the following:

- 1. Include money orders/checks payable to **U.S. Department of Homeland Security** for \$370.00 for the Form I-539 filing fee and \$85 for the biometric services fee or complete Form G-1450 Authorization for Credit Card Transactions (two separate payments).
- 2. Complete Form I-539 (Please answer all questions, sign, and date in black ink or type. If the question does not apply, you will indicate N/A and None for numeric responses).
- 3. Include the new I-20 form prepared by the International Student Office.
- 4. Write a letter to **USCIS** requesting reinstatement and explain the reason for failing out of status. You will provide documentation to support the explanation.
- 5. Provide current proof of financial support (official bank letter, three monthly bank statements, & notarized affidavit of support form).
- 6. Provide photocopies of the passport, including the photo page, the page with the passport's expiration date, visa page, and F-1 approval notice (if applicable).
- 7. Provide original I-94 card or copy of the F-1 entry stamp of the passport along with your electronic I-94 Arrival Departure Record. You can print your electronic I-94 Arrival Departure Record at https://i94.cbp.dhs.gov/194/#/home.
- 8. Provide copies of all previous I-20s (all pages, all institutions).
- 9. Include an enrollment verification from current school and official transcripts from all schools attended while on a student visa.

If the reinstatement is approved, USCIS will send an approval notice and an updated I-94 card to the student. If the reinstatement is not approved, the student will be asked to depart the U.S. Contact the **Coordinator of International Student Admissions via email at <u>pmsolomon@waketech.edu</u> to set up an appointment and wait for a confirmation to submit your application.**
