Why is the info session important?



If you are planning on applying to Wake Tech's Radiography program, you need to know there are Radiography program-specific admission requirements.

Being accepted into the Radiography program is not as simple and easy as applying to the college.

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First... Be a Wake Tech Student



Become a student at Wake Tech by completing the application process at
apply.waketech.edu

Submit official copies of transcripts from GED/high school and all previously attended Colleges/Universities to transcripts@waketech.edu. Once received, your file will be reviewed for admission and course placement.

Complete the Test of Understanding with a grade of 100% or better.

Email us at hsadvising@waketech.edu to let us know when everything has been completed.

Pre-Radiography status

Once everything has been completed, your major can be pre-Radiography student.

What does pre-Radiography mean? This means you are now accepted at Wake Tech as a student and can register for classes working towards entry into our Radiography program.

- College transcripts can be officially evaluated for transfer credit
- You can register for the general education classes
- Your advisor will be any of the Admission/Academic Advisors who specialize in health science program admissions.

Transfer credit



Wake Tech only evaluates official transcripts.

- **Advisors do NOT award transfer credits.**
- It is the student's responsibility to follow up with Student Records for transfer credit.
- If you have questions/concerns about transfer credits, please email tranevalreq@waketech.edu.

A transcript review can take 3–4 weeks to process after you have been accepted as a student, not from the time you submitted your transcripts.

Students may be required to submit a course syllabus if additional information is needed.

Please note for BIO and MAT classes – Wake Tech may award credit, but if the BIO classes are more than 5 years old or the MAT class is more than 10 years old, the Radiography program will not accept them.

When your assigned registration date begins, register for general education courses

Not sure what classes you need

- Remember advisors can best assist you if you have submitted any college transcripts. If you schedule an advising appointment before your transcripts have been received, we won’t know what classes you have completed.

Applying for RAD classes

To apply to take the RAD courses, you must complete the following:

1. Demonstrate Reading/English proficiency (ENG 111)
2. Demonstrate Math proficiency (MAT 110)
3. Demonstrate Science proficiency (BIO 163)
4. Be Certified Nurse Aide I (active and listed on registry)
5. Complete ATI TEAS exam
6. Submit RAD program application before deadline

Nurse Aide I

To be eligible to submit the program application, students must be listed on the NC Nurse Aide Registry, <https://ncnar.ncdhhs.gov>, as a Nurse Aide I by the program application deadline and the listing must stay current through the first day of RAD classes.

- To verify, students will need to submit a copy of their NC Nurse Aide registry listing with the program application.
- The only exception is if a student is already a NA 2 or an LPN. You will need to submit verification of your listing from the NC Board of Nursing. Must be current.

Wake Tech's Workforce Continuing Education Division offers a Nurse Aide class. The registration process is done online at <http://nurseaide.waketech.edu/>. Please note the registration cost will not be covered by financial aid.

Complete a Nurse Aide training program at any state-approved facility. List is at the NC Nurse Aide registry webpage.

The Nurse Aide requirements may continue to change. We recommend checking with a Health Sciences Admission/Academic Advisor for the latest Nurse Aide requirements.



Make sure when planning classes, you also plan time to complete a state-approved Nurse Aide training program and have time to take the written exam and skills exam to be listed on the NC Nurse Aide registry.

Common questions with Nurse Aide (CNA)

- I am in health care already. Do I still have to be a Nurse Aide?
 - Yes. You can check with the NC Nurse Aide registry to see if they have any challenge exams. Bottomline, you need to show that you are on the registry.
- I can't register for the Nurse Aide class. What do I do?
 - If you are taking the Nurse Aide class at Wake Tech, you do not register for the class using the normal registration system, Self-Service. Our Nurse Aide classes are taught through WCE. The direct webpage is nurseaide.waketech.edu
- I will complete the Nurse Aide class by the application deadline. Can I still apply?
 - No, you cannot apply. **You must be listed on the NC Nurse Aide registry by the application deadline.** To be on the registry, you must complete a state-approved Nurse Aide training program, pass a state written exam, and pass a state skills exam.



ATI TEAS– Test of Essential Academic Skills

The ATI TEAS is a timed exam developed to measure essential skills in the academic areas of reading, mathematics, science and English. The highest score in each area will be used in calculating the Composite Score.

Official scores must be sent to Wake Tech via atitesting.com by the application deadline

Retest policy - May only test twice per calendar year with 30 days between tests.

The TEAS must be taken within 3 years of the Radiography application deadline.

We accept the ATI TEAS V version and above.

Why are TEAS scores important?

- They award points. Besides for your grades, you can earn points in the competitive process based on your TEAS composite score.

What does Superscoring mean?

Please note that you will have to pay ATI to send us test scores to us.

I submitted the program application, so how do I begin RAD classes?

- Radiography is a limited enrollment program with a selective admission process based on a point system
- **We do not have a wait list!**
- Entry into the RAD classes is a competitive process. There is **NO GUARANTEE** that you will be accepted into the RAD classes even if you complete all of the general education classes.

Points Calculation Chart

- Points are only awarded for the RAD general education classes.
- The better the grade, the more points you will earn. The more points you earn, the more competitive you will be.
- **However, please note that every semester is different, and we cannot predict what points you will need to be accepted into the Radiography program.**

Program Application Deadlines

Radiography Program entry	Program Application Deadline
Fall (August)	January 31 st . Points will be awarded for classes completed through fall semester of prior year.
Spring (January)	July 31 st . Points will be awarded for classes completed through summer semester of the same year.

What can you do to make sure you are competitive?

- **One of the most common mistakes a student makes is taking too many classes.** When you are registering for classes, don't take more classes than you can successfully make "A"s and "B"s.
- To be competitive for our Radiography program, you will probably need at least a 3.5 GPA in the program-specific general education classes and score at least a 71% or better on the ATI TEAS test.
- Self-motivation, self-discipline, time management, and the ability to prioritize are all essential ingredients to be successful in our Radiography program.
 - Plan your schedule
 - Make a weekly to-do list
 - Prioritize your work
 - Break large tasks into their smaller components
 - Set goals and deadlines for projects
 - Avoid perfectionism and procrastination
 - Honestly assess the amount of time you waste

All applicants need to complete the following:

- Take the Test of Understanding. Score a 100% or better to verify you completed this session.
- Submit a Wake Tech application
- Submit official educational transcripts
- Email hsadvising@waketech.edu to let us know the above 3 steps are completed

If you have completed all classes and are ready to submit a Radiography program application:

- Submit the program application and all supporting documentation to
hsadvising@waketech.edu
 - Submit official TEAS scores from ATI
 - Submit Nurse Aide verification

If you need to register for general education classes, meet requirements to register:

- Activate your Student Account
- Complete New Student Orientation
- Complete eLearning Intro to be able to register for virtual classes
- Schedule an appointment with a Health Sciences Admissions/Academic Advisor
- Apply for Financial Aid, if needed

Registering for non-RAD classes

Once you have been accepted to Wake Tech as a pre-Radiography student, you can register for the general education classes.

- Wake Tech has 3 semesters:
 - Fall semester (begins in August) – 16 weeks
 - Spring semester (begins in January) – 16 weeks
 - Summer semester (begins in May) –10 weeks
- Check the Registrar's web page for Registration priority dates
- If you need academic advising, schedule an appointment with a Health Sciences Advisor.

Remember, you CANNOT register/take RAD classes

- Competitive admission to take RAD classes
- Must submit the program application
- Only students with the most points can register for RAD classes.

Important considerations
before applying to Wake Tech's
Radiography program

Clinical requirements

- Clinical sites require documentation of criminal background checks, drug testing, and health and immunization information. Wake Tech requires this information to be on file for each health science student before they begin the clinical portion of their health science program of study. Results of these tests could impact your ability to complete nursing clinical courses and therefore your ability to meet radiography program requirements or completion
 - **Physical Examination Form**
 - **Immunization Records (including flu and covid vaccines)**
 - **Criminal Background Checks**
 - **Drug Testing**
 - **Current BLS CPR**
- Our Radiography program requires students to have health insurance coverage for clinical instruction. Students must provide proof of coverage.
- NOTE: Health and immunization requirements for clinical sites are frequently updated and subject to change. For more information contact Barbara Smith, Clinical Compliance Administrator, at **basmith1@waketech.edu** or 919-747-0105.

Time Commitment/ Course Requirements

- The Radiography program is considered to be a full-time commitment. It will be difficult to complete class, study, work and be successful.
 - Patient contact will be required.
 - You may see blood or other bodily fluids.
 - You may be required to stick things in places you'd never thought you'd have to stick something...example, performing a Barium Enema...just saying!
 - Training is physically demanding. Expect Standing and walking for 4 hours at a time while actively engaged in radiographic procedures. Pushing and moving stretchers and wheelchairs with patients from patient areas to procedure rooms. Pulling and moving patients to and from radiographic table. Lifting/carrying and attaching extra radiographic table components for specific procedures. Utilize good body mechanics. Pushing heavy mobile radiographic equipment throughout the hospital.
- Radiography classes are an important commitment and investment in the future. Be prepared for the dedication.
