Wake Technical Community College will reopen the Knightdale High School off-campus instructional site (OCIS), effective August 16, 2021. The institution indicated that 25% (one course) of the Certificate program in Criminal Justice Technology: Introduction will be offered at the site via a hybrid format. The institution will transfer specialized instructional equipment and academic support materials to a specific classroom at the site to support the course. The students enrolled at the site will have access to the student support services and library and learning/information resources available to all students.

We accept notification to reopen the Knightdale High School off-campus instructional site (OCIS). The site was closed on January 4, 2019, and will be reopened as of August 16, 2021, fewer than five years after closure.
