

Salzburg College Summer Session II 2018 June 17-July 7, 2018

The 3-week faculty-led Summer Session II in cooperation with Wake Tech CC offers an introduction to various aspects of Austrian and European culture. The academic course work emphasizes the special opportunities provided by the Salzburg setting. Field experience, including visits to historical sites, to cultural and professional institutions and the attendance of musical events constitute an important part of the program.

Course Offerings

BUS 137 PRINCIPLES OF MANAGEMENT (3 hrs)

This course provides an introductory survey of the major functions of management.

MUS-110 MUSIC APPRECIATION (3hrs)

This course is a basic survey of the music of the Western world. Emphasis is placed on the elements of music, terminology, composers, form, and style within a historical perspective.

ECO 252 PRINCIPLES OF MACROECONOMICS (3hrs) This course introduces macro-economic topics and analysis of major schools of economic thought.

Excursions

A two-day trip to Vienna, Austria's historical capital, will provide a broad range of experiences related to history, art, music, and modern life. In addition, a variety of local field trips and excursions constitute an integrated part of the academic program.

Housing

To maximize cultural involvement, students live in a guesthouse dormitory in the heart of Salzburg where breakfast is also served. Weekday lunches are provided by Salzburg College. Dinner is on your own.

Program Cost: \$ 2,930

The cost includes program fee, room and some meals, a variety of local excursions and social events, a 2-day trip to Vienna (no meals other than breakfast), a day trip to Hitler's Eagle's Nest, a day trip to the Salzkammergut, a day trip to Munich and a day trip to Innsbruck.

Cost does not include passport, transatlantic transportation and international health insurance.

Additional fees on behalf of home institution may apply. Non-refundable **\$ 500 deposit due upon registration.**
