



# Searching for classes via WebAdvisor/Self-Service

**Step 1:** Access WebAdvisor by using the Logins drop-down menu in the top right-hand corner of the Wake Tech Community College web page.




Step 2: Select Future Student.




**Step 3:** Click Admissions Information and a drop-down menu will appear. Choose "Search for Curriculum Sections".




**Step 4:** A Search for Sections Form will appear. Input the term, subject, and course number and click submit.




**Step 5:** A listing of all sections of the course being for searched will appear below. Click the blue hyperlink for more information about a particular section.






## **Self-Service**


**Step 1:** Access Self-Service by using the Logins drop-down menu in the top right hand corner of the Wake Tech Community College web page.




Step 2: Click View Courses Without Signing In.




Step 3: Click Advanced Search.




**Step 4:** A Search for Courses and Course Sections Form will appear. Input the term, subject, and course number and click Search.
