- **Students who have no previous experience or who do not currently work in a human-services position should follow the process for applying to complete WBL 112 and WBL 115. Students who have six months or more of human-services work experience may apply to receive field experience credit for your prior work experience. Students should contact the department clinical coordinator the semester prior to completing the field experience requirement for details.
