PST 171- PST179 These courses are mechanisms for awarding prior learning credit for industry-recognized training and/or credentials. The prior learning source is NC Community College System (NCCCS) continuing education regulated by the State Board of Community Colleges and accredited through Southern Association of Colleges and Schools Commission on Colleges (SACSCOC). A minimum of 16 to 368 hours of official documentation for successful completion of the state-mandated training must be provided and retained on file. Credits: 1-9
