Students are encouraged to meet with a Human Services Department Faculty Advisor before registering for courses in the Mental Health Certificate.

This certificate is designed for individuals who are enrolled in other human services programs and would like additional education on mental health or who are in professions where they will come in contact with individuals or groups with mental health challenges. For example, this will provide increased knowledge for individuals in the field of criminal justice, health care, childcare and business.

Students who are enrolled in more than one human services curriculum should speak with their advisor to discuss specific classes that are duplicated in the programs and determines available credit.
