#### How do you qualify?

- Be between the ages of 17 and 29
- Out of secondary school
- Unemployed or underemployed
- Have no education or work experience in cybersecurity

#### What options do you have?

You have a choice of specialty skills pathways, and all can lead to advanced training in cybersecurity. You can become a Certified Ethical Hacker!

- **CompTIA pathway**: Learn how to diagnose and troubleshoot computers and earn industryrecognized certifications such as CompTIA IT Fundamentals, A+, Network+, and Security+.
- CISCO pathway: Learn how to troubleshoot network systems and earn certifications such as CCENT, CCNA, CCNA Security, and Linux.
- Cybersecurity pathway: Learn how to troubleshoot and secure networks against threats.
