Dear Dr. Boone:

Thank you for your letter of May 8, 2012, notifying the Commission on Colleges that Wake Technical Community College will terminate the following programs, effective fall 2012:

C Language Programming Certificate

The program currently has eighteen students; they will be allowed to complete the certificate or transfer to the A.A.S. degree in Computer Engineering Technology. All faculty members who teach courses connected to the certificate will remain at the college since they are also part of the Computer Engineering Technology associate degree.

Web Content Management Certificate

Students currently enrolled in this certificate will be allowed either to finish this program or transfer to the Web Developer certificate or the A.A.S. degree in Web Technologies. All classes which are part of the Web Content Management certificate are also embedded in the Web Technologies associate degree; all faculty members will remain employed in the associate degree program.

Electronics Engineering Technology: Robotics Certificate

The program currently has sixteen students enrolled in this certificate; they will be allowed to complete the certificate or transfer to the A.A.S. in Electronics Engineering Technology. All faculty members will remain employed in the associate degree program.

Healthcare Informatics Certificate

The program currently has no students enrolled in this certificate. Faculty members connected with this certificate are also part of the A.A.S. degrees in Computer Information Technology and Medical Office Administration.

Digital Media Certificate

Students currently enrolled in this program will be allowed to complete this certificate or transfer to the following programs: Graphics and Design certificate, Web and Graphics Design certificate, or A.A.S. in Graphic Design.

Please provide information on how students were notified of the termination of the programs. Action will be deferred pending review of the requested information, which should reach my office no later than September 14, 2012.

In addition, the Word Processing/Publication Certificate will be renamed to Office Documents Certificate.
