Wake Technical Community College will close the Certificate program in Electrical Systems Technology. The certificate was taught only at the Vernon Malone College and Career Academy off-campus instructional site (OCIS). The site will continue to operate.

There are no students enrolled in the program; therefore, there are no students to notify; there is no need for assistance with degree completion; no possibility of students incurring additional charges or expenses related to the closure; and no need for teach-out agreements with other institutions.

Faculty and staff members associated with the program were notified of the closure by email or in online meetings. Faculty, staff, and equipment related to the program will be redeployed to the related Associate in Applied Science (A.A.S.) degree program.

The Board of Trustees of the Southern Association of Colleges and Schools Commission on Colleges approves the closure of the Certificate program in Electrical Systems Technology.
